Dogs up to 80 pounds are allowed. There are no additional pet fees. Dogs are not allowed to be left alone in the room.

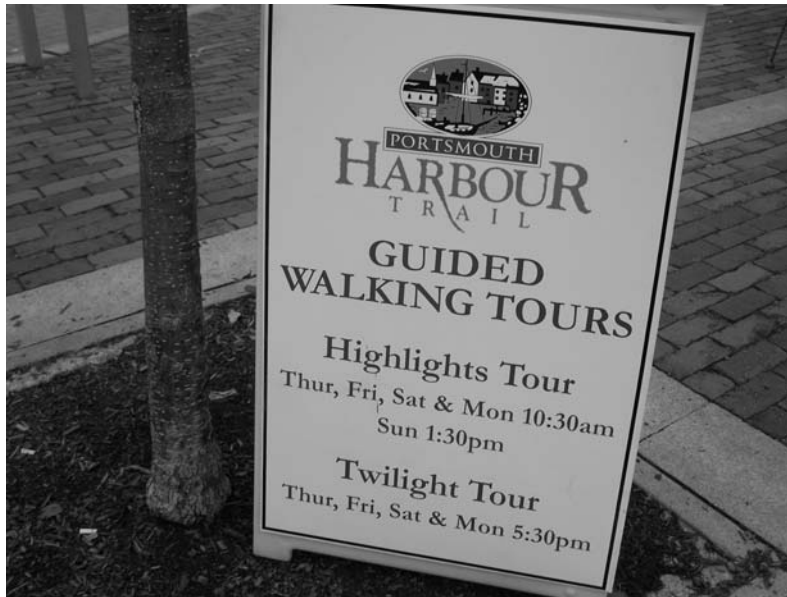
Campgrounds and RV Parks
