Originally set aside as a Heath Hen Reserve in the early 1900's, this park covers 5,100+ acres in the heart of Martha's Vineyard, and is now the focal point of one of the largest environmental restorations projects in the continental US. Dogs are allowed throughout the park and on the trails. Dogs must be under their owner's control, be on no more than a 10 foot leash, cleaned up after, and have proof of current rabies inoculation.

Dogs must be on leash and must be cleaned up after in the park area. They are not allowed in any buildings. It is open daily 9am-5pm. The park commemorates the heritage of the world's preeminent whaling port during the 19th century.

Natural Bridge State Park

This 48 acre seasonal park offers many unique geological features, an old marble quarry, a short walkway through a chasm, walking trails, picnic areas, and scenic overlooks. Dogs are allowed throughout the park and on the trails. Dogs must be under their owner's control at all times, be on no more than a 10 foot leash, cleaned up after, and have proof of current rabies inoculation.

Tufts University School of Veterinary Medicine

The campus of this veterinary school is located among rolling hills with several great walking trails, and although private property, they welcome hikers with their canine companions. If you are eastbound on Highway 30, there is a parking area off to the left as you are just passing the university. Dogs may be off lead only if they are friendly and well behaved with people as well as other animals, and they respond to voice control. Please clean up after your pet when on the trails and you will need to bring your own supplies.

There is parking at both ends of the trail, and restrooms are available at the Elwell parking area. Dogs are welcome to walk this path also. They must be under their owner's control, leashed, and cleaned up after at all times.

A very diverse area with at least 13 habitat types from a variety of forests, rich wetlands, to open slabs of bedrock, this 1200 acre wildlife area supports numerous species, and offers a 22 mile trail that winds through several sections of the park. Dogs are allowed for no additional fee. Dogs may only be off lead if they are under good voice control, and they will not chase

wildlife. Dogs must be leashed in public areas, and cleaned up after at all times.

Pilgrim Memorial State Park

Although the smallest park in the state, it draws a large number here to see where the passengers of the Mayflower first disembarked on this continent and turned an unassuming glacial bolder that sat on the shore into a famous symbol for the pioneering spirit. Dogs must be under their owner's control at all times, be on no more than a 10 foot leash, cleaned up after, and have proof of current rabies inoculation.

Rich in cultural and natural history, this day-use coastal park offers sweeping views, trails and tide pools, meadows of wildflowers, a visitor center in an historic 60 foot tall building that gives views up to the coast of Maine, and summer interpretive programs. Dogs must be under their owner's control, be on no more than a 10 foot leash, cleaned up after, and have proof of current rabies inoculation.

Dogs must be on leash and must be cleaned up after in most of the park areas. You must follow local and state park rules and pet policies for trails and camping. The area starts 10 miles north of Boston and extends for 40 miles along the scenic coast of Massachusetts. It features auto touring, boating, camping, hiking, swimming, and more.
